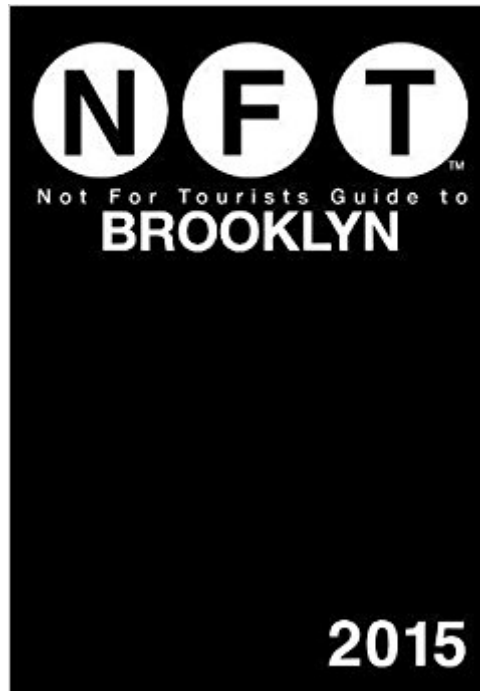




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Not For Tourists Guide To Brooklyn 2015

The NFT New York City world is primarily, but not exclusively, Manhattan; in fact the very first NFT was called "Manhattan", and you can still see copies of the distinctive black cover in the back pockets of people who live in the "City". The newly published "Not For Tourists Illustrated Guide to New York City" still maintains that Manhattan focus, but thankfully adds more about the outer boroughs. So, it is a real pleasure for this New Yorker at heart (and often on the ground) to discover this excellent version devoted to Brooklyn. It is particularly good at introducing people to the Newton Creek Water Treatment plant, a fascinating tourist attraction on European tours -- ranking top ten on many lists -- but virtually unknown to New Yorkers. This version continues the tradition of locals talking and griping about the place. Read with a grain of salt, but there is always a bit of local substance between the lines. Honestly, there is a bit of superficiality in these pages. To allow me to dig deeper while on the ground, I carry both the NFT and the wonderful "Encyclopedia of the City of New York, Second Edition" around on my iPhone as I wander the streets and avenues. Skim the surfaces with NFT, dig really deep with the Encyclopedia -- the City rewards every taste. One real problem with the eBook version: the maps are really small, ok for someone who knows where stuff is and just needs to check a cross street, but you need to get one of the free maps from the tourist bureau to really hone in if you are from out of town.
