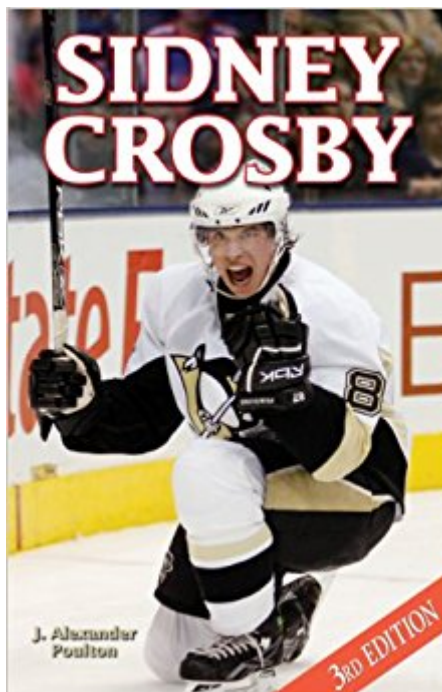

This upstart hockey champion from Cole Harbour, Nova Scotia, has led a seemingly charmed life, garnering awards and firsts since he learned to skate at age three.* He is the captain of the Pittsburgh Penguins--the youngest player in history to be named such--and has led his team to its first Stanley Cup since 1992* In his first season Crosby became the youngest player in NHL history to score 100 points in a season* He became the youngest player in NHL history to score 200 points overall* Crosby was the youngest player to win the Art Ross Trophy for the most goals scored in a season in 2007* He has also won the Hart Memorial Trophy, the Lester B. Pearson Award, the Mark Messier Leadership Award and the Maurice Rocket Richard Trophy* When asked if anyone could break his records, Wayne Gretzky said that Sidney Crosby could* After a suffering crushing defeat by the Red Wings in 2008, Captain Crosby led his Penguins through a tough season, an intense playoff and past those same Red Wings in the finals to win the 2009 Stanley Cup Championship, but they could not repeat in 2010* Crosby scored in overtime of the gold medal game at the 2010 Vancouver Olympics to help Canada to its 14th gold, a record number of gold medals by any country in the history of the Winter Games.

Since this book was published in 2011, and Crosby is still playing today, it is a little out dated. The book does not and could not have known that the Pens are still struggling today, or that Sid earned another gold medal in 2014. I'm not saying you should completely throw the idea of this book away though, because it's still a great book for present day hockey history, and the only way the author could have avoided this is by waiting for Sid to retire and who knows how long that could be.
