

Polar Bear Bowler is a book without words. I was a bit skeptical of this at first but after reading the book with my grandkids, I am sold. Rather than sitting passively and listening to the book, they get involved and want to be the one to tell the story. They actually argue over who gets to describe the actions. We have had quite a few very imaginative versions and the older ones look for details that allow them to spin the story towards different scenarios. I would caution that this is not a good choice for bedtime as the younger ones get quite excited about telling the story.

The illustrations are well done and, even with no words to accompany them, bring out personalities in the bear and penguins. I envision kids excitedly coming up with their own words to tell the story as you turn the pages.Highly recommended kids' book.

POLAR BEAR BOWLER is a wordless picture book about a polar bear that stows away on a ship from near Greenland and travels to Antarctica. There he runs into some penguins that he mistakes for bowling pins. The penguins don't take kindly to this and soon the creatures are in a snowball fight. Later, the penguins play a trick on the polar bear. The feud continues until the polar bear thinks of a great idea to bring them together. There are a few panels in the story that are confusing but other than that, POLAR BEAR BOWLER is a cute little story.
