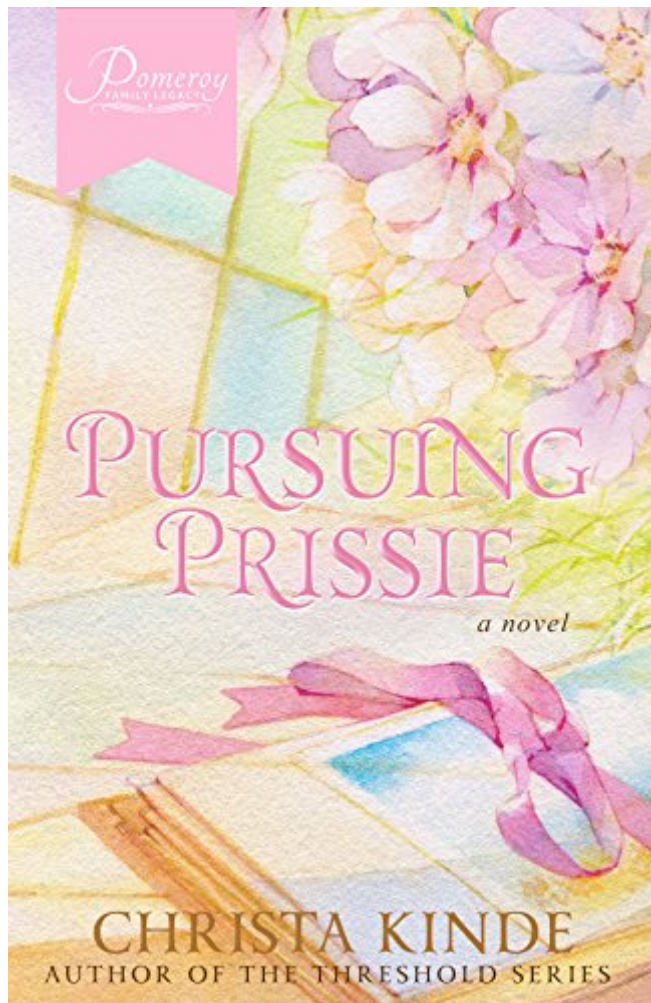


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Pursuing Prissie

Ten years after Prissie Pomeroy first saw an angel in her family's orchard, Prissie is suddenly swept up into the matters of the unseen world again. When a demon begins to take a special interest in her, old friends and new rally to her defense, but that's not the only development in Prissie's life. Her old friend, Ransom Pavlos, has returned from studies abroad, and the first thing on his agenda is to win Prissie's heart. Prissie, however, has no idea of his intentions and is too distracted by her angelic friends to notice the human one that's trying to win a way to her side. The long-awaited sequel to Christa Kinde's excellent and enjoyable Threshold Series, Pursuing Prissie does not disappoint. It's filled to the brim with fabulous wording and exciting adventures, not to mention spiced with romance. However, since the characters in this book are ten years older than in the Threshold Series books, more mature themes are included. Therefore, I recommend that parents of kids under the age of fourteen should use discretion. That aside, I totally recommend this book!

As with the other books in this series, I enjoyed the plot and subplots. The author doesn't rush through anything instead she lets the story unfold very naturally. Allowing the story to cover a longer time frame adds to the authenticity of the tale and makes readers consider their own lives. Giving all the glory to God is another trademark of this series.
