

Anne M. Khademian received a Ph.D. in political science from Washington University in St. Louis and was a research fellow at the Brookings Institution. She has taught political science and public affairs at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and was a visiting associate professor at the University of Michigan. In 2001 she was a visiting senior fellow with the Fox Leadership Program at the University of Pennsylvania. Today she is an independent author and researcher. Her books include *The SEC and Capital Market Regulation: The Politics of Expertise* (1992) and *Checking on Banks: Autonomy and Accountability in Three Federal Agencies* (1996).

This book is an indispensable examination of leadership best practices for organizational culture. This is an accessible, yet well-reasoned book that would appeal to advanced undergraduate students, graduate students, and lay persons in management and civic affairs.
