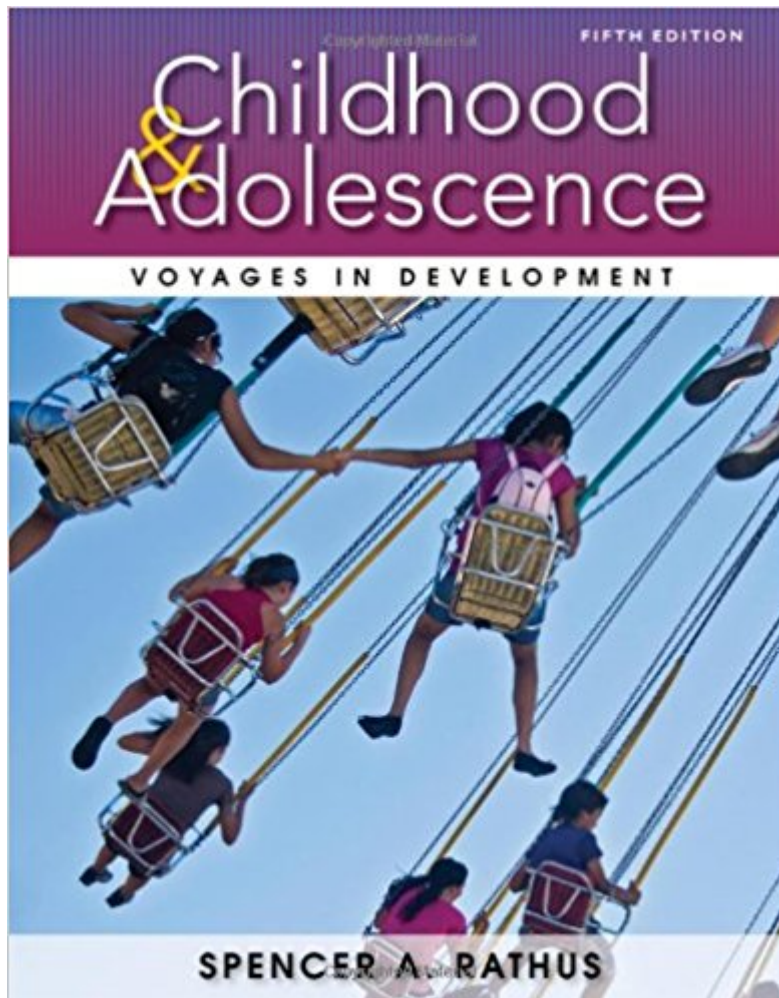

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If this textbook is to be used for an overview class (either intro or start of a series) then the book is great. However there is quite a bit that is simply mentioned and never brought up again. For example, in the parts that deal with cognitive, social, and emotional developments there are several theories discussed, but some seem to be favored, specifically Piaget's which is broken down well along with Freud's and Erikson's. Other theories don't receive as much attention or seem to be glossed over. I think the other aspects of development are covered fairly well and I enjoyed reading the book.

The book was great, very informative, etc. What I had an issue with is the fact that, believe it or not, this book comes in several formats. You won't know this right away, but like in my case, right before the final I found out that my book ended 3 chapter short. Why? I guess they print them with 13 chapters and some with 16 chapters. No idea why. But when you pay a good amount for the book, you expect it to have "the entire" content. This is the first time I've ever encountered such a confusion and misrepresentation!
