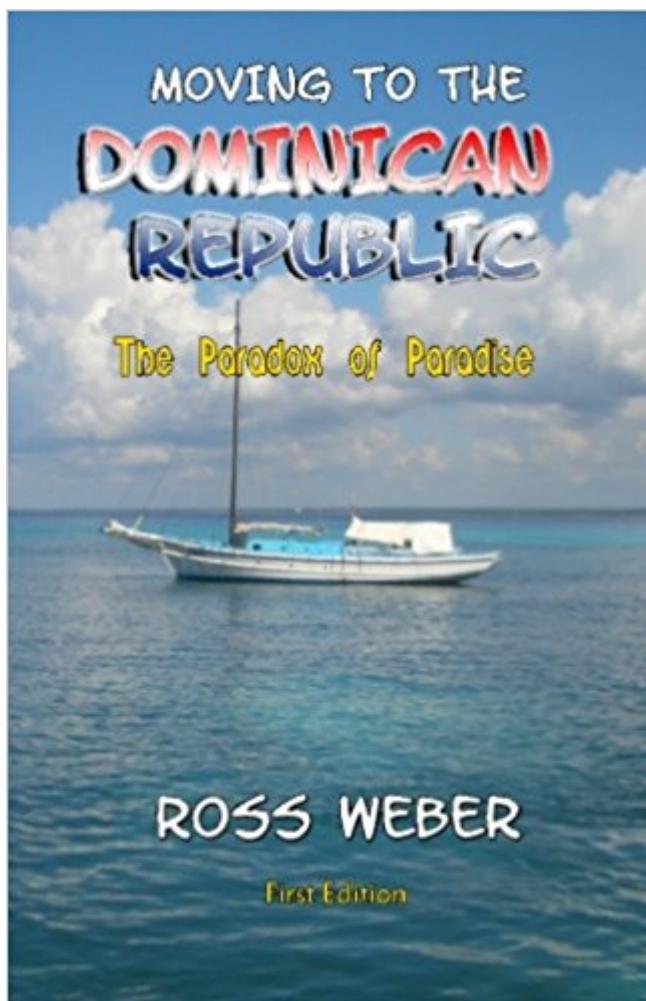


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Moving To The Dominican Republic: The Paradox Of Paradise
