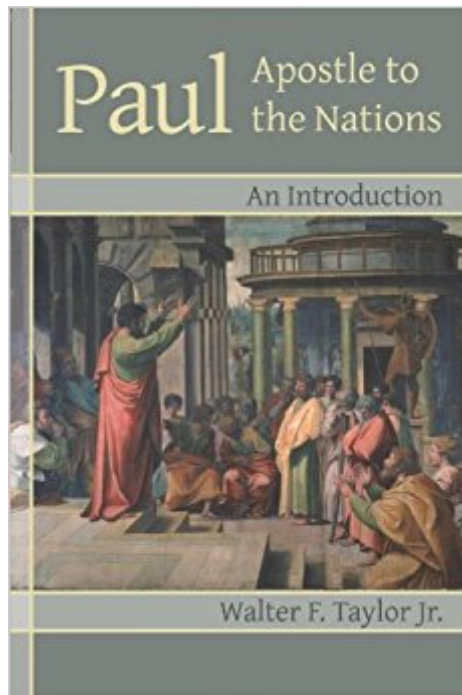

This 300 plus (Kindle page) book has the novice in mind and does provide an excellent platform. The author provides a section called "How to Use This Book" which gives the reader an idea of what life was probably like in the 1st Century. The book has 2 parts, 1st part is Titled: Who was Paul and What Did He Do? The 2nd is Titled: What Did Paul Write? There's also a "Suggested Reading" section to encourage the reader to move forward with their study. The first part of the volume has 5 Chapters complete with pictures and study questions for reflection and discussion. The reader can expect topics such as, Historical & Political Study, The Books of Acts, How Did Paul Travel, Paul's Social Network & How Did Paul Begin Congregations. The 2nd part has 8 Chapters also is complete with pictures and study questions for reflection and discussion. In this section the reader can expect these topics, Reviewing 1 Thessalonians, Galatians, 1&2 Corinthians, Romans, Philippians & Philemon. I found Dr. Taylor's book enjoyable and clear is his teaching. His scholarship is excellent.
